Indications for Use

Invivo Workspace Web Viewer is a software application used for the display and 3D visualization of medical image files from scanning devices, such as CT and MRI. It is intended for use by radiologists, clinicians, referring physicians, and other qualified individuals to retrieve, process, render, review, and assist in diagnosis, utilizing web user interface. Additionally, Invivo Workspace Web Viewer is a preoperative software application used for the planning and evaluation of dental implants placement and surgical treatments.

This device is not indicated for mammography use.

Required Training

Prior to any clinical applications using Invivo Workspace Web Viewer, user is recommended to take training and practice for the following content:

View digital image in 2D and 3D; image operations such as pan, zoom, brightness/contrast adjustment; place implant at given location; move and rotate implant; and change implant parameters. The user is recommended to contact Osteoid technical support for a full software training at 408-333-3484 ext. 4.

Software Layout


The following is a description of how Invivo Workspace Web Viewer is organized by Toolbar, View Control Panel, and Rendering Window.

Toolbar

Tools can be accessed to perform certain functions on patient images.

View Tabs

The View Tabs perform specific tasks or look at specific subjects of interest by adjusting the Toolbar and View Controls.



Control Panel

The **Control Panel** is the region where patient images can be manipulated and controlled. The **Control Panel** is associated with a specific **View Tab**.

Rendering Window

Rendering Window is the region where patient images are displayed. This window can be customized within many of the View Tabs by using the Toolbar.

Image Navigation

Below is an explanation showing how to manipulate images in the rendering window with the keyboard and mouse.

Slider Scroll



- Click and drag the slider (e.g. opacity, brightness, etc.) to adjust the image.
- Click the slider header text to reset the slider to the center position.

Zoom In/Out

- Place the mouse cursor in the center of the image you want to zoom.
- Hold down the "Control" key + left-button on the mouse.
- While holding down the buttons indicated above, move the mouse up and down on the screen.
- This shrinks/enlarges the image: Down vertically zooms out. Up vertically zooms in.



Pan (Shift)

- Place the mouse cursor in the center of the image you want to shift.
- Hold down the "Shift" key + left-button on the mouse.
- While holding down the buttons indicated above, move the mouse any direction to achieve the desired image displacement.



Free Rotate

Applicable only for 3D images.

- Place the mouse cursor in the center of the image you want to shift.
 Hold down the left-button on the mouse.
- While holding down the left-button, move the mouse in any direction to achieve the desired rotational position.



Free Rolling

Applicable only for 3D images.

- Hold down the "Space" key + left-button on the mouse.
- While holding down the buttons indicated above, move the mouse up and down to rotate the image about a central axis.



Clipping

Applicable only for 3D images.


 Place the mouse cursor over the center of the image, then scroll the mouse wheel forward or backward to clip the anatomic plane as you like (after enabling clipping in the Control Panel).



Scroll Slice

Use when you would like to move through the series of sections when in the 2D slice views.

 Place the mouse cursor in the center of the image then scroll the mouse wheel forward or backward to move one section at a time as you advance through the data slices.



Section View Features

The **Section View Tab** gives the ability to view the X, Y, and Z sections (axial, coronal, sagittal) simultaneously for 2D visualization, measurements, and the utilization of several image enhancement features. Invivo Workspace Web V iewer also integrates 3D functions in the Section V iew Tab.



Section: Control Panel



Slices Control

- Brightness & Contrast: Can be adjusted for each of the presets to enhance the image.
- Slice Thickness: Uses ray sum when reconstructing the 3D image along each orthogonal plane.
- Sharpening: Applies the selected sharpening filter from the drop-down menu to the 2D slice renderers.
- Reset Slices: Resets the orientation of the 2D slices altered with the rotation widgets to the scan orientation.

Volume Control

- Preset: Sets the rendering type of the 3D volume.
 - Bone: Shows a realistic view of patient anatomy
 - Teeth: Shows a translucent skeletal view highlighting the teeth, roots, and bone
 - Soft Tissue: Shows translucent soft tissue
 - Soft Tissue+Teeth: Combines the Teeth and Soft Tissue renderings
- Opacity: Adjusts the translucency of the volume
- Brightness & Contrast: Can be adjusted for each of the presets to enhance the image.

Clipping

- Check the "Clipping" box to slice the image along the predefined anatomical planes (sagittal, axial, coronal, and arch) and to reveal the clipping options.
- To switch the clip to the opposite side, click "Flip."
- Select the amount of volume to clip in the drop-down menu.
- Scrolling the mouse wheel or slider moves the clipping plane.

Layout


• Toggle between the available layout options.

Image Info

- Dimension, resolution, and field of view size are summarized.
- Warning: Images may be resampled for browser display optimization. Resampled images may not be the same size and resolution or contain the same details as the original scan and are indicated in the rendering window.

Section: Rendering Window

This window allows viewing of the X, Y, and Z sections (axial, coronal, sagittal) and custom sections or a 3D view simultaneously. This allows the clinician to have very accurate 2D visualization and 2D measurements.



Scroll wheel: Move mouse pointer to the desired cross section. Use the scroll wheel to move the slice up and down.

Cursor: Grab one of the cursors (axial, sagittal or coronal). Move the cursor in the desired direction. The corresponding image is updated.

Zoom: Click and hold the left-click mouse button on the image and the "Ctrl" key on the keyboard. Drag the mouse cursor up and down to zoom in and out.

Pan: Click and hold the left-click mouse button on the image and the "Shift" key on the keyboard. Drag the mouse cursor to move the image.

Reorientation: Click and drag the arrow widgets to reorient the scan. Changes in orientation only apply in the Section tab

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ArchSection View Features

ArchSection View Tab is a sectional image exploration view. Instead of conventional X-Y-Z sections, this view allows the user to review the image in dentally meaningful perspectives using multiple cross sections, traversing the lengths of the dental arches.



ArchSection: Toolbar

Shown below are the Toolbar and tools that are loaded with the ArchSection Tab:





About: Displays the software version information.



Reset: Resets the window to the original view.



Distance Measurement: After selecting this tool, click two points to mark the desired distance. A number in millimeters automatically displays.



Angle Measurement: Select this option and mark three points on the volume, and the angle between them appears. Clicking on their control points and moving the cursor can modify measurements. Click on the measurement and press the "delete" key to delete it.



Polyline Measurement: Select this option and mark any number of points in the slice view. Right-click to end the measurement, and the total distance appears. Clicking on the nodes and moving the cursor can modify points. Click on the measurement and press the "delete" key to delete it.



Arrow Notation: Allows an arrow to be drawn on the image.



Circle Notation: Allows a circle to be drawn on the image.



Text Notation: Allows text to be written and edited on the image.



Create Arch Spline: After selecting this tool, create a new arch spline or edit an existing arch spline. Left-click to place nodes along the arch. Right-click or double-click to finish the arch spline. To modify an existing arch spline, drag the nodes to the desired positions. To move the arch while maintaining its shape, click and drag the central spline.



Arch Spline Ruler: Places ruler along the arch spline for easy reference.



Reorientation: Adjusts the patient orientation and the visible range of the scan.



Rotate Cross Section: Adjusts the patient orientation in the cross sections.



ArchSection: Control Panel



Slice Control

- Brightness and Contrast can be used to adjust the image.
- Slice Thickness: Allows for the cumulative thickness of the slices to be viewed in the cross sections.
- Sharpening applies the selected sharpening filter from the drop-down menu to the 2D slice renderers.
- Reset Slices: Resets slice rotation if applied.

Pano Control

- Slice mode displays a single cross section along the panoramic curve (blue).
- X-ray shows the ray sum (reconstructed x-ray) in the focal trough.
- Ruler: Displays a ruler on the bottom of the panoramic image.
- Maxillary Arch and Mandibular Arch options allow two different arch splines to be viewed. Switching between the two options changes which spline is manipulated and used in creating the panoramic and cross sections. These options are only available if the uploaded case has different arch splines created.


Cross Slice Control

- Width: Cross-section width.
- Interval: Distance between the subsequent cross sections.

ArchSection: Rendering Window




Arch Cursor: Notice the green, orange, and yellow coordinate indicators. These ArchSection coordinate indicators show the spatial location within the ArchSection rendering window.

- Cross Section Indicator: The green lines give the location of the cross sections along the arch spline.
- Axial Slice Indicator: The orange line shows the axial coordinate position within the section.
- Arch Spline: The yellow spline in the center of the arch spline represents the current position where the arch section has moved.
- Cross Section: Mouse scrolling within any one of the three sagittal frames advances the slices to the patient's
 right or left and causes the green coordinate indicator to move mesial or distally in the axial and pano sections
 simultaneously.
- **Axial Section:** Mouse scrolling within the axial section advances the sections superiorly or inferiorly and causes the orange coordinate indicator to move superiorly or inferiorly in the cross or pano sections simultaneously.
- **Pano Section:** Mouse scrolling within the coronal frame advances the slices buccally or lingually and causes the yellow coordinate indicator to move buccally or lingually in the axial and cross sections simultaneously.

The Implant View Tab contains implant information and views for reviewing existing implant plans.



Implant: Control Panel



Volume Control:

- Rendering Preset: Different settings allow for better visualization of certain anatomic structures, soft tissue profiles, hard tissue, etc. This is achieved by displaying specific densities with specific colors.
- Opacity: Allows for the translucency/opacity to be adjusted.
- Brightness & Contrast: Can be adjusted for each of the presets to enhance the image.
- Visible: Allows the 3D Volume Rendering to be turned on or off from view.

Slice Control

- Brightness and Contrast can be used to adjust the image.
- Slice Thickness: Allows for the cumulative thickness of the slices to be viewed in the cross sections.
- Sharpening: Applies the selected sharpening filter from the drop-down menu to the 2D slice renderers.

Clipping

- Check the "Clipping" box to slice the image along the predefined anatomical planes (sagittal, axial, coronal, and arch) and to reveal the clipping options.
- To switch the clip to the opposite side, click "Flip."
- Select the amount of volume to clip in the drop-down menu.



 Toggle on and off visibility of available model and prostheses.

Implant Control:

- ID Drop-down menu: Select available implants from the drop-down. The selected implant is highlighted in the 3D rendering view, and the 2D slices are updated to show the axial and two cross-sectional views of the selected implant. Implant details and parameters appear below once an implant is selected.
- Mfr.: Implant manufacturer
- Prod.: Implant product type
- Implant dimensions: Diameter and length

Implant: Rendering Window



Axial Section: Top left window. This section is the view from the top of the implant. The yellow A-B line passing through the axis creates the view seen in the middle window. Scrolling the mouse wheel after clicking inside the axial window, or clicking and dragging the line changes the cross section seen in the middle and bottom views as the line rotates about the axis of the implant.

2D Section: Middle and bottom left windows. The A-B line passing through the implant in the axial view creates the cross-section view that appears in the axial view and is set by default to be positioned at the level of the implant emergence point. Scroll the mouse wheel after clicking inside the middle and lower windows, or click and dragthe A-B line in the axial slice to change the cross section views.

Volume Rendering: Right window. This view displays the 3D volume in the selected rendering preset. If available, implants, models, and prosthesis can be visualized in 3D.



Model View Features

The **Model View Tab** allows the user to see the patient's Imino Model or 3D photograph and create surgical or orthodontic simulations, as well as 3D soft tissue predictions. An Imino Model is a 3D digital study model that is made by Osteoid on a case-by-case service. The DICOM data of the patient is sent to Osteoid where it is modeled to create the most advanced digital study model available. Invivo Models contain anatomy such as roots, developing teeth, impactions, alreolar bone, and more, while other models merely show the crowns of teeth. The 3D photograph service that Osteoid offers is also viewed here. Osteoid developed the technology to combine a frontal photo of the patient and the CT scan to create a 3D model that overlays the scan data.

Any nerve tracing, implant planning, or superimposition that has been done is also visible in the Model Tab. Each item can be independently turned on/off to see how all these systems come together with the scan data.



Models:

- Models: The individual, digital models (implants, abutments, restorations, nerves, teeth, superimposition) can be turned on or off in the rendering window.
- Additional settings for model visibility and display are available once a model is selected.
- Show All and Hide All toggle the visibility of all the listed models.

View Presets:

• Preset toggles that display predetermined views. A custom view can also be set.

Volume Control:

- Rendering Preset: Different settings allow for better visualization of certain anatomic structures, soft tissue profiles, hard tissue, etc. This is achieved by displaying specific densities with specific colors.
- Opacity: Allows for the translucency/opacity to be adjusted.
- Brightness & Contrast: Can be adjusted for each of the presets to enhance the image.
- Visible: Allows the 3D Volume Rendering to be turned on or off from view.

Clipping

- Check the "Clipping" box to slice the image along the predefined anatomical planes (sagittal, axial, coronal, and arch) and to reveal the clipping options.
- To switch the clip to the opposite side, click "Flip."
- Select the amount of volume to clip in the drop-down menu.
- Scrolling the mouse wheel or slider moves the clipping plane.


Simulation

- Select a simulation from the drop-down menu
- Press **Play** to view the simulated movement.
- Use **Start** and **End** or the slider bar to jump to different frames of the simulation.

Model: Rendering Window



This window allows the viewing of Invivo Models, 3D photographs, and simulation, all of which are services that must be ordered per case for this feature to work. These services provide excellent diagnostic data and case presentation material.

Model: Model Settings



When a model is selected, additional options become available for adjusting the model's appearance and properties.

Visibility:

- Visible: Allows the model to be turned on or off from view.
- Opacity: Allows for the translucency/opacity to be adjusted.

Rendering:


- Mode: Surface and wireframe options are available for the texture of the model. Wireframe converts the model to a wire mesh form when selected.
- Shading: Smooth and Flat options are available for adjusting the shading.
- Back Face Culling: Determines the visibility of the surface textures from certain viewing angles
- No Clipping: When toggled, the model is exempt from the global clipping setting.

Material

• Ambient, Diffuse, and Specular Color: Determine the color of the model.

Model: Custom View Preset Setup

Visibility presets allow for easy switching between set views. Each option can be adjusted by the user. To configure these settings, click on **Setup**.



- Visibility checkboxes hide or show features in the rendering window.
- Skin Opacity: Controls the visibility of the face photo wrap from the Invivo Model workup file or 3DAnalysis. Varying degrees of transparency can be obtained with the slider.
- Jaw Opacity: Controls the visibility of the jaw models. Varying degrees of transparency can be obtained with the slider.
- **Reset Preset:** Returns the preset to the default settings.

Gallery View Features

The Gallery View Tab archives images that have been captured or imported in Imino.






Images: Gives a list of all captured images.

- Controls settings for 2D images.
- For grayscale images in the Gallery, the user has the option to adjust several settings such as Gray Scale Threshold, Brightness, Contrast, and Sharpening.


